

Do not mark the ballot for more choices than allowed.</li> <li>If you mark the ballot for more choices than permitted, that contest or question will not be counted.</li> <li>To vote for a write-in candidate: completely darken the oval (●) to the left of the blank line and write in the candidate's name. Only votes cast for candidates who filed as write-in candidates can be counted</li> <li>Do not write in a candidate's name if that person's name already is printed on the ballot for that same contest.</li> <li><b>If you make a mistake or want to change your vote:</b> return your ballot to an election official and get a new ballot. <p><b>Issue 1</b></p> <p><b>To Reduce Penalties for Crimes of Obtaining, Possessing, and Using Illegal Drugs</b></p> <p><b>Proposed Constitutional Amendment</b></p> <p><b>Proposed by Initiative Petition</b></p> <p><b>To add a new Section 12 to Article XV of the Constitution of the State of Ohio</b></p> <p><b>A majority yes vote is necessary for the amendment to pass.</b></p> <p>If adopted, the amendment would:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Require sentence reductions of incarcerated individuals, except individuals incarcerated for murder, rape, or child molestation, by up to 25% if the individual participates in rehabilitative, work, or educational programming.</li> <li>• Mandate that criminal offenses of obtaining, possessing, or using any drug such as fentanyl, heroin, methamphetamine, cocaine, LSD, and other controlled substances cannot be classified as a felony, but only a misdemeanor.</li> <li>• Prohibit jail time as a sentence for obtaining, possessing, or using such drugs until an individual's third offense within 24 months.</li> <li>• Allow an individual convicted of obtaining, possessing, or using any such drug prior to the effective date of the amendment to ask a court to reduce the conviction to a misdemeanor, regardless of whether the individual has completed the sentence.</li> <li>• Require any available funding, based on projected savings, to be applied to state-administered rehabilitation programs and crime victim funds.</li> <li>• Require a graduated series of responses, such as community service, drug treatment, or jail time, for minor, non-criminal probation violations.</li> </ul> <p><b>SHALL THE AMENDMENT BE APPROVED?</b></p> <p><input type="radio"/> YES</p> <p><input type="radio"/> NO</p>		<p><b>PROPOSED TAX LEVY (SUBSTITUTE)</b></p> <p><b>BENJAMIN LOGAN LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT</b></p> <p><b>A majority affirmative vote is necessary for passage.</b></p> <p>Shall a tax levy substituting for an existing levy be imposed by the Benjamin Logan Local School District, Logan, Hardin, and Union Counties, Ohio for the purpose of providing for the necessary requirements of the school district in the initial sum of \$1,375,000 and a levy of taxes be made outside of the ten-mill limitation estimated by the county auditor to require three and eight-tenths (3.8) mills for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to thirty-eight cents (\$0.38) for each one hundred dollars of valuation for the initial year of the tax for a continuing period of time, commencing in 2019, first due in calendar year 2020, with the sum of such tax to increase only if and as new land or real property improvements not previously taxed by the school district are added to its tax list?</p> <p><input type="radio"/> FOR THE TAX LEVY</p> <p><input type="radio"/> AGAINST THE TAX LEVY</p>			<p><b>PROPOSED TAX LEVY (RENEWAL)</b></p> <p><b>PERRY TOWNSHIP</b></p> <p><b>A majority affirmative vote is necessary for passage.</b></p> <p>A renewal of a tax for the benefit of Perry Township for the purpose of fire protection at a rate not exceeding one and one-half (1.5) mills for each one dollar of valuation which amounts to fifteen cents (\$0.15) for each one hundred dollars of valuation, for five (5) years, commencing in 2018, first due in calendar year 2019.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> FOR THE TAX LEVY</p> <p><input type="radio"/> AGAINST THE TAX LEVY</p>
